

What it Looks Like?

look at the picture below.




Habitat

The Canadian forests is home to the Woodland Caribou. These strange animals love the cold. Surprisingly they like the old-growth forests where the lichen is not so rare. Living close to the mountains the caribou love to go through the deepest part of the snow. They travel in about herds of 100 000. Strangely these mammals never make a home. Their winter feeding ground is about 5000 kilometers from their summer feeding ground.



What it Eats?

The Woodland Caribou have a strange diet. These mammals are herbivores. The ground weeds and tree leaves are their main source of food. If they find tree lichen they enjoy this because it is their favourite food. They also do not mind berries, mushrooms and reindeer moss. When they find cud they chew on it. A fun fact is that they have a special stomach to help them break down food.



Special Features

Every animal has special features to help them survive in their environment. For example the caribou has split hooves like a snowshoes to help them through deep snow. They also have sharp edges around their hooves to chip away ice for water. A rough pad in their mouth to tear food. These are just some features that help
